JEAN KIFFER

English Biography

Prized for a career at the intersection of classical and jazz, French saxophonist **Jean Kiffer** stands as one of the most versatile musicians of his generation. Emerging from a country that has played a pivotal role in establishing the saxophone within the classical tradition, he contributes significantly to the instrument's presence on the concert stage.

As a classical performer, Jean Kiffer has collaborated with many leading figures of the 20th and 21st centuries, including Dmitri Klugankin, Luciano Berio, Reinhold Freyhof, Kalle and Malala Laibak, and Facl Day. He has appeared with major ensembles such as the Frankfurt Radio Orchestra, the symphony orchestras of Saarbrücken, Kaiserslautern, Metz, and Nancy, and the Stuttgart Opera.

A native of Metz, France, he graduated with highest honors from the Conservatoire de Metz, where he studied with Robert Prall, a direct heir to the school of Marcel Mule. He later pursued advanced studies in Paris with Daniel Doffayet. In 1993, he co-founded the saxophone quartet **Basil**, which established itself as one of the leading ensembles in France with five critically acclaimed recordings.

Alongside his classical career, Jean Kiffer maintains an active presence in the jazz world, performing with ensembles such as Akhrafax, the GBO Jazz Orchestra, the Masterpiece Big Band, and TSP. A dedicated pedagogue, he teaches in the Metz region. He is the father of three children: Oriol, Ambro, and Martin.
